# The process for adding a firearm to your licence (excluding handguns and category C firearms) is as follows:

## 1. Obtain a support letter.

Either a property or club letter (if you own the property, you will be able to fill the form in yourself). The club you join, or the size of the property that you have access to; will dictate which firearm/calibre you may be able to apply for. Please note; if you wish to hunt with a firearm, you must use a property letter to apply for the firearm/s. Using a property letter will allow you to hunt (on a property that you have permission for) or use the firearm at a club. Using a club letter means you can only shoot the firearm at a club.

## 2. Choose/purchase a firearm.

If you have a firearm/s in mind please let us know and we can help you look into pricing and options.

## 3. Obtain the serviceability form.

This is a form that a dealer can complete and sign once they have the firearm in their possession. It is a form that identifies the firearm you wish to licence (with its serial number, etc).

#### 4. Complete an online application (addition).

#### 5. Submit the Application.

You then take all of this paper work to the post office with 100 points of ID. This is where you submit the application. It is now a matter of waiting for correspondence from Police Licensing.
